Opening Acclamation & Collect (standing)

Bishop Blessed be God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

People And blessed be his kingdom, now and for ever. Amen.

Almighty God, to you all hearts are open, all desires known, and from you no secrets are hid: Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy Name; through Christ our Lord. **Amen**.

THE PRESENTATION

The bishop and people sit. The Presenters, standing before the bishop, present the ordinand, saying

Diane, Bishop in the Church of God, on behalf of the clergy and people of the Diocese of West Missouri, we present to you Rita Jo Carson Kendagor to be ordained a priest in Christ's holy catholic Church.

Bishop

Has she been selected in accordance with the canons of this Church? And do you believe her manner of life to be suitable to the exercise of this ministry?

Presenters

We certify to you that she has satisfied the requirements of the canons, and we believe her to be qualified for this order.

The Bishop says to the ordinand

Will you be loyal to the doctrine, discipline, and worship of Christ as this Church has received them? And will you, in accordance with the canons of this Church, obey your bishop and other ministers who may have authority over you and your work?

Answer

I am willing and ready to do so; and I solemnly declare that I do believe the Holy Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be the Word of God, and to contain all things necessary to salvation; and I do solemnly engage to conform to the doctrine, discipline, and worship of The Episcopal Church.

The Ordinand then signs the above Declaration in the sight of all present.

All stand. The Bishop says to the people.

Dear friends in Christ, you know the importance of this ministry, and the weight of your responsibility in presenting Rita for ordination to the sacred priesthood. Therefore, if any of you know any impediment or crime because of which we should not proceed, come forward now, and make it known.

If no objection is made, the Bishop continues
Is it your will that Rita be ordained a priest?

The People respond with these or other words

It is.







The Sermon (seated)

The Rev. John Spicer Rector, St. Andrew's Episcopal Church

The Nicene Creed (standing; prayed in unison)

We believe in one God,

the Father, the Almighty,

maker of heaven and earth,

of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,

the only Son of God,

eternally begotten of the Father,

God from God, Light from Light,

true God from true God,

begotten, not made,

of one Being with the Father.

Through him all things were made.

For us and for our salvation

he came down from heaven:

by the power of the Holy Spirit

he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary,

and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate;

he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again

in accordance with the Scriptures;

he ascended into heaven

and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son.

With the Father and the Son he is worshipped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

We look for the resurrection of the dead,

and the life of the world to come. Amen.

THE EXAMINATION

All are seated except the ordinand, who stands before the Bishop.

The Bishop addresses the ordinand as follows

My sister, the Church is the family of God, the body of Christ, and the temple of the Holy Spirit. All baptized people are called to make Christ known as Savior and Lord, and to share in the renewing of his world. Now you are called to work as a pastor, priest, and teacher, together with your bishop and fellow presbyters, and to take your share in the councils of the Church.

As a priest, it will be your task to proclaim by word and deed the Gospel of Jesus Christ, and to fashion your life in accordance with its precepts. You are to love and serve the people among whom you work, caring alike for young and old, strong and weak, rich and poor. You are to preach, to declare God's forgiveness to penitent sinners, to pronounce God's blessing, to share in the administration of Holy Baptism and in the celebration of the mysteries of Christ's Body and Blood, and to perform the other ministrations entrusted to you.

In all that you do, you are to nourish Christ's people from the riches of his grace and strengthen them to glorify God in this life and in the life to come.

My sister, do you believe that you are truly called by God and his Church to this priesthood?

Answer I believe I am so called.

Bishop Do you now in the presence of the Church commit yourself to this trust and

responsibility?

Answer I do.

Bishop Will you respect and be guided by the pastoral direction and leadership of

your bishop?

Answer | will.

Will you be diligent in the reading and study of the Holy Scriptures, and in Bishop seeking the knowledge of such things as may make you a stronger and more able minister of Christ? I will. Answer Will you endeavor so to minister the Word of God and the sacraments of the Bishop New Covenant, that the reconciling love of Christ may be known and received? I will. Answer Will you undertake to be a faithful pastor to all whom you are called to serve, Bishop laboring together with them and with your fellow ministers to build up the family of God? I will. Answer Will you do your best to pattern your life in accordance with the teachings of Bishop Christ, so that you may be a wholesome example to your people? I will. Answer Will you persevere in prayer, both in public and in private, asking God's grace, Bishop both for yourself and for others, offering all your labors to God, through the

mediation of Jesus Christ, and in the sanctification of the Holy Spirit? I will.


Answer

THE CONSECRATION OF THE PRIEST

All stand except the Ordinand, who kneels facing the Bishop and the Presbyters who stand to the right and left of the Bishop.

A period of silent prayer follows, the people still standing. The Bishop then says this Prayer of Consecration

God and Father of all, we praise you for your infinite love in calling us to be a holy people in the kingdom of your Son Jesus our Lord, who is the image of your eternal and invisible glory, the firstborn among many brethren, and the head of the Church. We thank you that by his death he has overcome death, and, having ascended into heaven, has poured his gifts abundantly upon your people, making some apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry and the building up of his body.

Here the Bishop lays hands upon the head of the Ordinand, the Priests who are present also laying on their hands. At the same time, the Bishop prays

Therefore, Father, through Jesus Christ your Son, give your Holy Spirit to Rita; fill her with grace and power, and make her a priest in your Church.

May she exalt you, O Lord, in the midst of your people; offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to you; boldly proclaim the gospel of salvation; and rightly administer the sacraments of the New Covenant. Make her a faithful pastor, a patient teacher, and a wise councilor. Grant that in all things she may serve without reproach, so that your people may be strengthened and your Name glorified in all the world. All this we ask through Jesus Christ our Lord, who with you and the Holy Spirit lives and reigns, one God, for ever and ever.

The People in a loud voice respond Amen.

The new priest is now vested according to the order of priests.

The Bishop then gives a Bible to the newly ordained, saying

Receive this Bible as a sign of the authority given you to preach the Word of God and to administer his holy Sacraments. Do not forget the trust committed to you as a priest of the Church of God.

The Bishop now anoints the hands of the new priest saying

The Father anointed our Lord Jesus Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit. By this anointing you are entrusted to take into your hands the holy things of God; you will join with our Lord Jesus to sanctify the Christian people, to lead his people in the sacraments of the Church, and to spread God's Kingdom in all the world.

The Bishop greets the newly ordained.

The Peace

The new Priest then says to the congregation


The peace of the Lord be always with you.

People And also with you.

The Presbyters present greet the newly ordained; who then greets family members and others, as may be convenient. The Clergy and People greet one another.

Celebrant Lift up your hearts.


People We lift them to the Lord.

The Celebrant proceeds with the Preface It is truly right to glorify you, Father, and to give you thanks...

...Countless throngs of angels stand before you to serve you night and day; and, beholding the glory of your presence, they offer you unceasing praise. Joining with them, and giving voice to every creature under heaven, we acclaim you, and glorify your Name, as we sing,



The congregation is invited to stand or kneel as the Bishop continues with the Eucharistic Prayer.

Therefore, according to his command, O Father,

Celebrant and People

We remember his death, We proclaim his resurrection, We await his coming in glory;

The Celebrant continues

By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. **Amen**.

As our Savior Christ has taught us, we now pray,

Our Father who art in heaven,
hallowed be thy Name,
thy kingdom come,
thy will be done,
on earth as in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread.


And forgive us our trespasses,

The Breaking of the Bread

The Celebrant breaks the consecrated Bread. A period of silence is kept.




Facing the people, the Celebrant says the following Invitation

The Gifts of God for the People of God. Take them in remembrance that Christ died for you, and feed on him in your hearts by faith, with thanksgiving.

All are invited to the altar rail. All baptized Christians are invited to receive Holy Communion without regard to denominational affiliation. If you have not been baptized or do not wish to receive Holy Communion, simply fold your arms across your chest, and the communion minister will know to give you a blessing instead. If you feel led to follow Christ in his call to be baptized, please see a member of the clergy immediately following this service to schedule your baptism.

Amen.

The Blessing

The Bishop then asks the new priest to bless the people. The new Priest says


The blessing of God Almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, be among you, and remain with you always. **Amen**.
